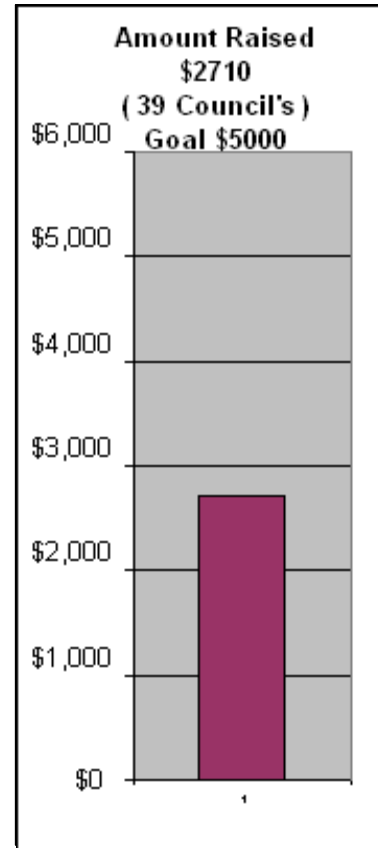

### COMMITTEE FOR HELPING PEOPLE WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES

The 2008 Tootsie Roll Drive is in full swing and so far the results are interesting. As of May 5th 31.46 per cent of the council reports have been audited. The audit is showing that overall the donations are running 7.87 per cent of 2007. If this holds true for the remaining council reports that need to be audited we could have a record year and exceed a gross of \$700,000 for the first time ever. Thus far reports audited by diocese is as follows.

Green Bay 44.4 per cent reporting down 0.2 per cent; LaCrosse 22 per cent reporting down 26.8 per cent; Madison 27.58 per cent reporting up 2.96 per cent; Milwaukee 37.5 per cent reporting up 39.5 per cent; and Superior 20 per cent reporting up 10.6 per cent.

There is along way to go yet in getting all the reports audited so we should be cautiously optimistic that we will exceed the 2007 drive. The committee would like to thank the entire Wisconsin Membership for their support of this very important program.
