### *Membership Musings*

By the time you get a chance to read the June edition of the Wisconsin State Newsletter, barely two or three weeks will remain of the current 2007/2008 Fraternal Year (FY). Even though the end is close, the FY is still not over. Therefore, I will cover two points, briefly (!?!?!). They are:

- **Last Minute Reminders**
- **The B.O.R.E.D. Report (of course)**

**Last Minute Reminders.** Okay, you just conducted your last First Degree Exemplification of the current Fraternal Year at the end of May or the very beginning of June. Consequently, you have achieved your Membership Recruitment Goals for FY 2007/2008. Congratulations to you and all the members of your Membership Recruitment Committee and your entire Council for a job well-done! You all deserve a great big "**ATTA-BOY!**"

But your job is not quite finished. Two steps are required. First, make sure the paperwork is done! In other words please make sure you have submitted copies of the completed and signed Form #100 to all the proper addressees. Send the top copy (original) to the proper address at the Supreme Council Offices (New Haven, CT); the second copy to your General Agent or Field Agent; and the third copy should be retained for your Council Records. In order to make sure your newly recruited Members officially count for this FY, it is important you submit this information as soon as possible. You should realize there is more than one floor and two employees at the New Haven address of 1 Columbus Plaza and, therefore, recording these data is not an overnight affair!!

Second, begin the Retention process for your latest Recruits immediately. In other words make sure that either or both the Retention Committee and Proposer spend some time orienting your Council's latest additions. Provide them with Council background material, assign them to a specific Council Program (of their choice), and inform them of upcoming Council Meetings and other related dates. Remember, Retention does not begin when a Member is about to be Suspended. Retention begins the moment a New Member receives his K of C Lapel Pin at his First Degree Exemplification!! Following these two steps will assure your Council of  "officially" achieving your Membership Recruitment Goals and  taking the first step toward securing a productive and active Brother Knight far into the future.

**The B.O.R.E.D. Report.** The Wisconsin Knights of Columbus is still in the running to achieve two significant goals for FY 2007/2008. The diligent data dabblers from the **Bureau Of Really Exciting Data (B.O.R.E.D.)** have noted that there is still a realistic chance the Wisconsin K of C can reach the goal needed to satisfy the Circle of Honor Award (151 needed as of 1 June 2008) and achieve a net loss of zero (-99 as of 1 June 2008). Membership and Membership Recruitment, statewide over the past three months (March – May 2008) has been unsurpassed. If Recruitment for June approaches the successful results obtained during the month of April (i.e. 153 New Members), the possibility and probability of achieving both goals noted above will be realized!!

### STATE CHARITY RAFFLE

As the State fiscal year comes to an end, I would like to report how the 2007 Raffle proceeds were disbursed at a State level. The State Officers reviewed and approved 113 Charity Requests for a total dollar amount of \$194,400. Only two requests were turned down because there did not appear to be a sufficient need to award a grant. Over 74 fire checks were issued for approximately \$22,000. We are out of funds from the 2007 raffle and still have 4 requests that have not been funded. These requests will come from the 2008 raffle proceeds in July. Everyone in the State should be proud of these accomplishments as we helped families who were in need in many communities throughout Wisconsin.

We were pleased with the results of the 2008 raffle since our gross income was up over .7 % which means that this was the year in which we stemmed the tide and went up. Hopefully, people who suffer are those who need help the most and you did it with an economy in the State of Wisconsin that is less than flamboyant.

With all of these good deeds accomplished in helping others, I wonder why many Councils do not properly support the raffle. For 2008, more than 20 % of the State or 58 Councils sold less than 2 tickets per member. I am asking these Councils, "**Is there something wrong with the raffle**"? There must be or we would not see this lack of support for the raffle. We need to hear from you as to what would motivate your Council to open the box of tickets and do a better job of selling them. Please contact your Diocesan Coordinator listed on Page 7 of the State Directory and let us know how the raffle could be improved. We promise that we will listen and respond to you regarding your issues. You can also contact me directly by letter, e-mail or phone call.

There are so many worthy families in our councils that should be recognized for all their efforts that don’t have a chance to be honored unless we have information on them.

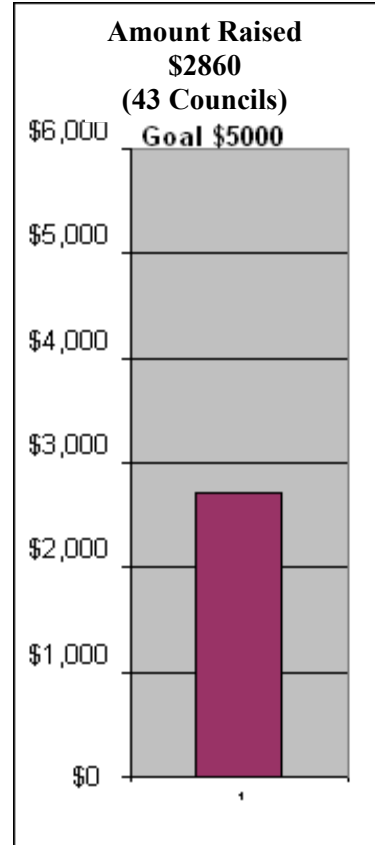

### STATE CHARITY GRANTS

The State Officers recently approved the following grants from the State Charity Fund:

\$2,000 to a young couple who has two daughters whose ages are 3 and 14 months who live in Hartford. The 14 month old was diagnosed with Spinal Muscular Atrophy and need to buy equipment to keep her airways clear.

\$1,500 to a 45 year old woman who was diagnosed with breast cancer and lives in Minocqua with a 16 year old at home and two youngsters in college. Her mother and two sisters died from breast cancer.

\$1,500 to a 53 year old PGK from Council # 7798 who is single and lives in Hartford and was recently diagnosed with antiphospholipid syndrome which means he is subject to blood clots in his system.

\$1,500 to a 49 year old single 30 year Knight who lives in Kewaunee and was recently diagnosed with cancer of the lymph glands.

\$2,000 to a 45 year old man with no children at home and lives in Oshkosh. He was recently diagnosed with testicular cancer and moved to his large intestines and lungs.

\$2,500 to one year old child who arrived on earth 12 weeks early and lives in Green Bay. Because of his early arrival has underdeveloped lungs, brain bleed, intestinal blockage and other gastrointestinal problems.

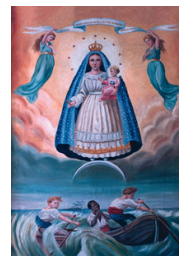

### SPECIAL OLYMPICS

After I wrote my report for the State Convention, things changed. We did have a fairly good year in 2007. 60 Councils reported to Supreme on Form 4584 with 6988 hours, 579 volunteers, 127 events, and \$46,421.00 donated to Special Olympics.

As a result Wisconsin tied for 2<sup>nd</sup> place in our division. We received a check, from Supreme, which I presented to Special Olympics at the Civic Opening of the convention for \$6,750.00. We easily could have been in 2<sup>nd</sup> place alone or maybe even in 1<sup>st</sup> place and received a larger grant, up to \$8,000.00, if all Councils had filed, and on time, Form 4584.

We did go over the \$1.00 per member for 2007. Lets us all do our best to reach the \$2.00 per member for 2008. Any projects that Councils do for Special Olympics must be reported to Supreme on Form 4584 during January 2008.

Summer time is a good time to do a fundraiser, Brat Fry, Steak Feed, Raffle, or any project where the proceeds are donated to Special Olympics. Donations can be made to Special Olympics Wisconsin or any local Special Olympics groups.

## Wisconsin Knights of Columbus Notes

### Charitable Contributions-Substantiation and Disclosure Requirements

In the June 2007 Badger Bulletin, an article was presented explaining that both the State Council and subordinate councils can accept tax deductible contributions from individuals for charitable purposes. The contributions must be deposited in and distributed from a segregated charity fund from general council operational funds. IRS Code Section 170 provides for this exception. These contributions qualify for tax deduction by a donor, provided that the donor has substantiation of any donation valued at \$250 or more. If your council has charitable transactions of this nature, the officers and financial secretary may be interested in accessing and printing IRS's Publication 1771-Charitable Contributions-Substantiation and Disclosure Requirements. This publication can be accessed on the Internet at [www.irs.gov/eo](http://www.irs.gov/eo), Forms and Publications, then selecting Publication 1771 from the drop down list.

This publication points out two general rules organizations need to be aware of to meet substantiation and disclosure requirements for federal income tax return reporting:

- A donor is responsible for obtaining a written acknowledgment from a charitable organization for a single contribution of \$250 or more to claim it as a deduction on their income tax return
- A charitable organization is required to provide a written disclosure to a donor who receives goods or services in exchange for a single payment in excess of \$75

A charitable organization can aid the donor by providing a timely written acknowledgment of a contribution. The IRS provides these guidelines for a written statement:

1. Name of organization
2. Amount of cash contribution
3. Description of non-cash contribution
4. Statement that no goods or services were provided by the organization in receiving the contribution
5. Description and fair estimate of value of goods or services that an organization provided in return for contribution, if any

The IRS provides no forms for this written acknowledgement. Letters, postcards or computer generated statements may meet the disclosure requirement. The written statement need not reference the donor's tax identification number. A copy of this statement need not be attached to the income tax return, but the donor needs to maintain it on file and present it upon IRS's request of its substantiation of the deduction claim. The fair estimated value of goods or services provided to a donor are deducted from the contribution amount for tax deduction. Goods or services include cash, property, services, benefits or privileges.
